THE FROST KING PRESENTED BY A MOVEABLE THEATRE

A Moveable Theatre was founded by Julia Johnson and Terry Hansen in Sydney in 1990. Throughout the next decade, AMT produced over 30 Children's Theatre Seasons for the Sydney Opera House Bennelong Program, Sydney Cove Authority at The Rocks and for the Royal Botanic Gardens Education Unit - Resident in School Holidays for three Years.

Our one hour rhyming performances of fractured fairy tales and fables have three primary aims:

- 1. To incorporate the environment in which they are set.
- 2. To engage and involve the audience in two essential ways:
 - Transporting them into the world of the story
- Giving them an active role in bringing about its outcome
- 3.To excite them to revisit both the environment and the text with a sense of fun and personal ownership

The Frost King by Louisa May Alcott (also known as The Power of Love) tells the story of Violet, who fearing the approach of a cruel Winter frost, travels to the home of The Frost King to find a way to thaw his cold heart and allow her flower friends to survive the approaching winter. Along the way, we learn that the smallest of us has strength beyond the physical; solving conflict through cooperation and the Power of Love.
